<p>Student Supports and Scholarships</p>	<p>The College of Education has a wide range of scholarships dedicated to teacher education. Scholarships are available to students enrolling in graduate teacher preparation programs. A new Logan Scholarship was announced in 2016 to benefit teacher candidates planning to work in public schools. The scholarship provides students with up to \$10,000. <p>Unique Attributes and Points of Pride</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The <b>College of Education</b> ranks as the 5<sup>th</sup> best public and 13<sup>th</sup> best overall graduate colleges of education (U.S. News and World Report, 2018).</li> <li>• The <b>Special Education Program</b> ranks as the 3<sup>rd</sup> best graduate program in the nation for the past 18 years (U.S. News and World Report, 2018).</li> <li>• For the 2018-2019 academic year, the <b>College of Education</b> awarded \$767,922 in donor funds providing 127 scholarships to its students.</li> <li>• The <b>Music Education Program</b> is a four-year degree and licensure program with 100 percent placement of its graduates seeking employment as K–12 public school music teachers for the past two decades. Alumni teach throughout the United States and internationally, including in China, Italy, Spain, and Vietnam.</li> <li>• The <b>UOTeach Program</b> has an integrated approach to equity and social cultural issues in education. At the completion of the program, students have the necessary knowledge and experience to take the qualifying examination for an ESOL endorsement.</li> <li>• The <b>Sapsik'wafá Education Project</b> prepares American Indians and Alaska Natives (AI/AN) as teachers whose knowledge, skills, and cultural sensitivity help to bring about long-term, much needed improvements in the elementary, middle and high school educational experiences of AI/AN youth.</li> <li>• The <b>Interdisciplinary Interventionists and Clinicians Improving Outcomes (INICIO) Project</b> will train forty-two Speech-Language Pathologists (SLPs) and Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) students at the University of Oregon to serve dual language learners (DLLs) from birth through age five with disabilities. The program requires scholars to complete five interdisciplinary core EI/ECSE and CDS courses and two field placements: one in the CDS young child lab with bilingual infants and toddlers and a second with preschoolers in a bilingual education program.</li> <li>• The <b>Equity Partnership Programs</b> are offered by the Department of Education:</li> </ul>

- UOTeachOUT program, an annual summit on gender identity and sexual orientation issues in education.
- [TEACH-IN](#) is a collaboration with district equity partners and the ODE Equity Unit in which K-12 teachers share resources, practices and examples from their everyday work with a focus on everyday culturally sustaining classroom practices.

- The **Oregon Research Schools Network** established by the College of Education is an effort to improve the academic and career outcomes for youth by placing University of Oregon faculty members in districts and buildings across the state. This would position the UO COE as the first college of education in the nation that extends service (Professional Development), instruction (dual credit classes), and research into schools statewide.
